Cleaning, greening and 'freecycling'

Over the past three years, CCRA has developed a programme of cleaning and greening. We have also offered an opportunity for you to 'freecycle' your unwanted treasures. Previous events have proved very popular, and have involved many volunteers from our area. Please come along and help to make the day a success. These events have helped to make a real difference to the look of our streets. We do hope you'll be able to help with some or all of the following events.

Cleaning

If you are willing to volunteer to clean up some of the messy corners around our area you will be issued with a natty green high-visibility vest, a litter picker and gloves. Sadly the council is not able, as it did two years ago, to take away large bulk items such as fridges and building rubble. If you are elderly or disabled and would like some help to get rid of small items of rubbish please contact Linda on the number shown above. She will try to get someone to assist you.

Greening

Freecycle

Recycling

In addition to the items which can be recycled in your normal blue-top wheelie bin, the council has agreed to collect batteries and textiles. If you have any of these which you wish to get rid of you can bring them along to the hall during the afternoon.



Taking responsibility for your own patch

Although the council has a weed control programme, one look around the area will tell you what Greenwich Council itself admits - that this year the programme has not worked. If each of us weeded the area immediately outside our own home, we could make a real difference. Similarly if we all tried to make sure that our front gardens and stretches of pavement were tidied we'd make a great difference to our area.

Drains

Two years ago, Greenwich Council promised a deep clean for all our drains. That never materialised. But this month Greenwich has begun a programme of 'gulley-sucking' and jetting. By July 2nd, our community day, all drains in the area will have been cleaned. What we can do is to try to make sure that during this period we try to avoid parking over drains. This will ensure that the gulley-sucker can get close enough to clean all drains thoroughly.

We are also in discussion with the engineers' department, to see what can be done about the smelly drains in the area – further reports in forthcoming issues of Grapevine.
